Dismas House's Recovery Grows Worcester program annually distributes produce low-income families facing food

insecurity in Worcester. This past year, we delivered 320 boxes of fresh, local produce to our community partners—that's 2,500 pounds of delicious vegetables! Next year, we hope to grow even more. Through a generous grant Supermarkets/Albertsons from Shaw's Companies, the Dismas Family Farm will be able to expand our Recovery Grows Worcester program next summer and help even more local families without easy access to healthy food get sustainable produce. However, as its name suggests, the Recovery Grows Worcester program is two-fold. Our residents at the Dismas Family Farm are former prisoners recovering from drug and alcohol addiction, so growing food for the hungry is an important means by which our residents reconcile themselves with the community and find fulfillment and purpose. We are so grateful for this support and for the opportunity it brings to help more Worcester families in need!

Advocacy

In the past year, the Dismas Community Organizing Initiative under Dismas graduate Mike Earielo's leadership has worked with a group of Dismas residents and family members on policy initiatives to improve the lives of former prisoners. This work has included convening a group of stakeholders to advocate to improve access at the local Social Security office. Additionally, Mike and his

team have represented Dismas at housing and other city forums to ensure the needs of former prisoners are being met during the pandemic, while also working on statewide decarceration efforts to lower the prison census The team is safely. continuing to work on these efforts as well as building partnerships address housing needs for prisoners.

- # Dismas House, the Dismas Family Farm and the Father John Brooks House are home each year to 65 homeless and former prisoners trying to rebuild their lives.
- # Over 300 volunteers, from families, churches, and local schools, help out at Dismas programs each year.
- # Dismas piloted a new family program, helping to reunite 1 family, a father and son, who now live in one of our programs.
- # The Dismas Family Farm grows over 20,000 pounds of vegetables each year!
- # The Dismas Family Farm has 13 sheep, 2 cats, 2 dogs, and 2 adorable miniature horses, Thelma and Louise.
